Discover the world war coastal defences on the Atlantikwall Raversyde and around the Vindictive memorial

Situated right by the sea, Raversyde offers visitors a unique combination of cultural history. The Atlantikwall is one of the leading attractions at the Belgian coast, and the perfect place to experience the atmosphere of the 'Longest Day'. The over 60 bunkers, observation posts and artillery positions combined with 2 kilometres of open or subterranean corridors constitute one of the best preserved parts in Europe of the 'Atlantikwall', built by the Germans during World War 2 from the French-Spanish border to Norway.



Combine your visit with a stroll around the Vindictive memorial in Ostend, which refers to the famous Zeebrugge and Ostend Raids during World War I. It is surrounded by more German bunker sites and Fort Napoleon.

The Atlantikwall also features the only preserved German coastal battery from WW1: the Aachen battery. Batteries were built along the coast out of fear for an Allied landing on the beach and to protect the ports of Zeebrugge and Ostend, the operating bases of the German submarines.
